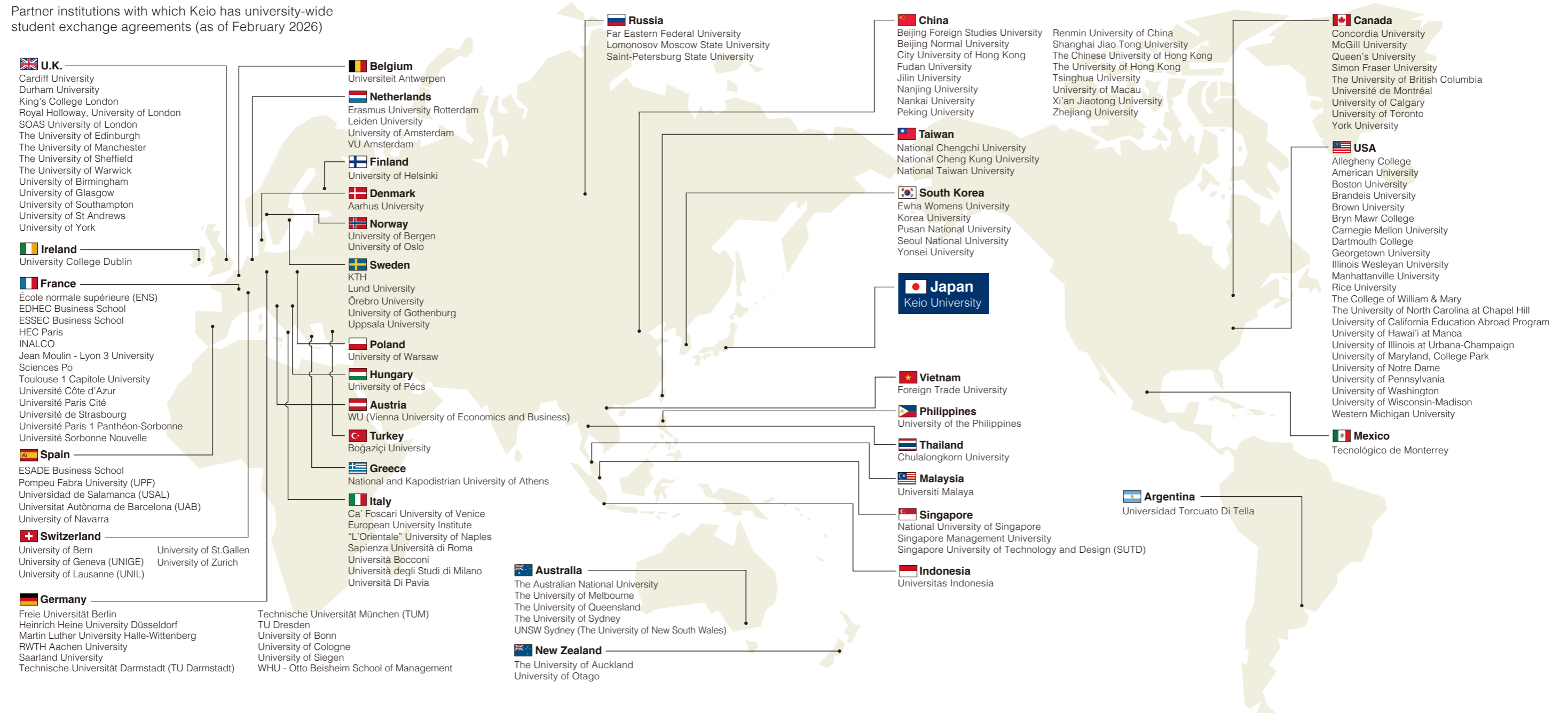


# WORLD-WIDE NETWORK

I had never considered studying abroad for university until my gap year after high school, when I decided to pivot from a focus on mathematics to pursue my long-standing interest in cancer biology. Inspired by a child-like curiosity for immunology and supported by parents who encouraged me toward Japanese innovation and scientific opportunities, I chose Keio SFC. I was drawn to the academic freedom it offered—to explore, develop, and experience intellectual interests beyond the life sciences. My professors and research mentors presented me with endless opportunities to see the world differently, telling me that I have the potential to solve its problems no matter my age or experience, and instilled in me a thirst to dare mighty things. I look back on my journey almost romantically, feeling as if fate brought me to Keio. There, I explored the frontiers of microbial bioinformatics, molecular oncology, and neurophysiology through research at the Institute for Advanced Biosciences, the RIKEN Center for Brain Science, and the Keio WPI-Bio2Q Research Center. Shaped by these experiences and driven by a desire to advance health equity in low- and middle-income countries, I sought to bridge basic and clinical sciences through applied engineering. This path led me to the Bioengineering graduate program at the University of Pennsylvania, where I now explore therapeutic and drug delivery approaches to advance innovative, accessible medical solutions while engaging in biotech commercialization and entrepreneurship through Penn Engineering's Widjaja Fellows Program. My philosophy is to learn to live as I live to learn. I encourage future Keio students, as they pursue dreams that may one day change the world, to remain grounded in their humanity.

My journey to Keio University began with a strong passion for applied economics. After completing my master's degree in Iran, I received the MEXT scholarship, which enabled me to pursue a Ph.D. at Keio, an institution closely aligned with my academic interests. Keio's strong reputation and the expertise of my supervisor, Professor Naoyuki Yoshino (now Emeritus), were decisive factors in my choice. His emphasis on policy-oriented research inspired me to specialize in energy economics and policy, a field of great importance to Japan, which relies heavily on energy imports. At Keio, I gained both academic knowledge and valuable professional experience. The university offered a dynamic research environment that encouraged collaboration with experts, policymakers, and industry leaders, deepening my understanding of real-world challenges. Beyond academics, I built lifelong friendships and developed perseverance and adaptability. I later began my academic career as an assistant professor at Keio, where I launched the Energy Economics, Environment, and Policy course in 2015, a meaningful milestone for me. Students were highly motivated and engaged. Keio students stand out for their strong English skills, curiosity, and critical thinking. Currently, I serve as a professor at Tokai University and as vice president of the International Society for Energy Transition Studies. My research focuses on energy policy, climate finance, and green investment strategies essential for a sustainable future. For anyone considering studying in Japan, I can confidently say that Keio University offers an environment where ambitious minds can truly thrive.

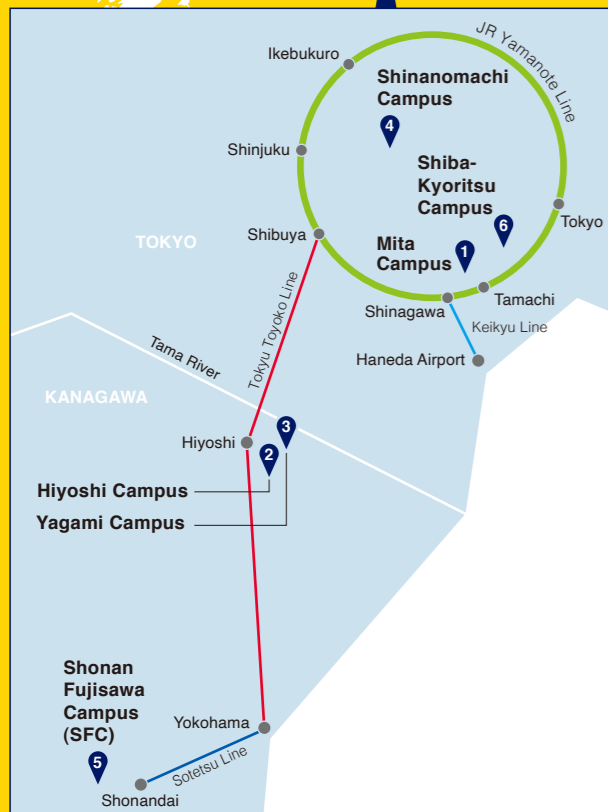

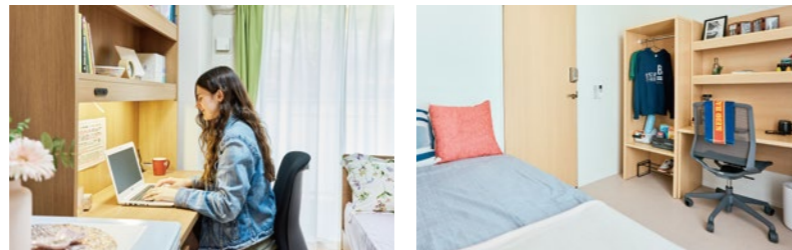
## Student Housing

I would say that while shared living could be challenging at times, the openness and friends you gain are absolutely worth it.

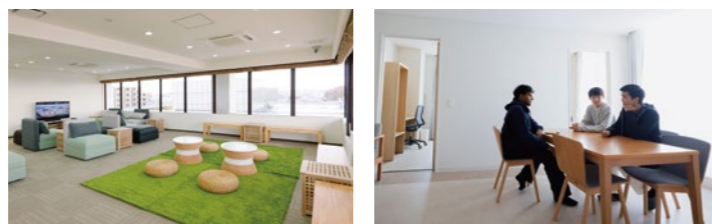

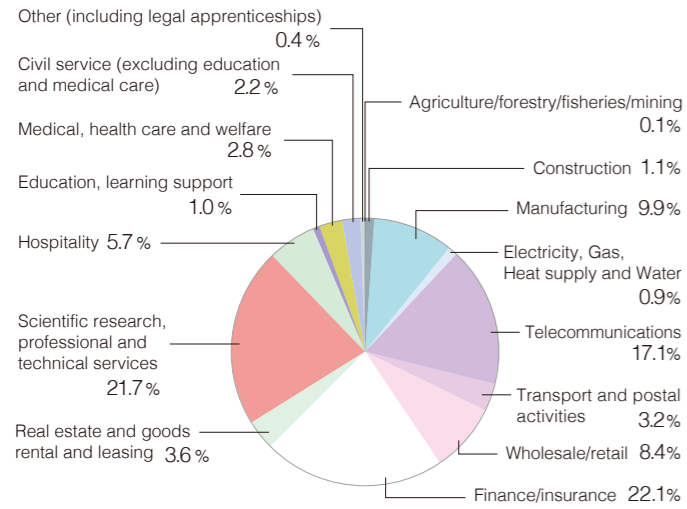
