7月9日(土).10日(日)の経済学研究科入試は、新型コロナウイルス感染症予防に十分留意しながら三 田キャンパスにて実施いたします。会場に来られない受験生への追試や遠隔での試験実施などの特別措 置は行いませんのでご了承ください。

新型コロナウイルス感染症予防対策等について

試験会場、控室は受験生同士の距離が保たれるよう座席指定を行います。また、定期的に室内の換気、消毒を行い、 係員はマスク、フェイスシールド等を着用します。

受験生のみなさまにおかれましては、マスクの着用、手洗い・うがいの励行等、感染症予防と体調管理に努め、試験 に臨んでください。試験当日は以下の対策についてご理解・ご協力をお願いいたします。

- 1) 修士課程 第1次試験(筆記試験)の試験会場には集合時刻の30分前から入構することができます。時間に余裕をも ってお越しください。第2次試験(口頭試問)の集合時刻は7月9日(土)19時にお知らせします。
- キャンパス入口にてサーマルカメラによる検温を実施します。発熱(37.5℃以上※)の疑いがあれば非接触体温 計で検温し、37.5℃以上の場合は入構できません。当日キャンパスに入構できなかった受験生に対し、追試等の特 別措置は行いません。

※平熱が高い等、特段の事情がある方は試験前1週間程度の体温記録をつけ、当日ご持参ください。

- キャンパス入構の際は必ずマスク(不織布推奨)を正しく着用し、キャンパス入口(正門または東門)で受験票を 提示してください。受験票・マスクがない場合は入構できません。ただし、写真照合の際は、係員の指示に従っ て,マスクの取り外しにご協力をお願いいたします。
- 試験会場入口に備え付けてあるアルコール消毒液の利用と手洗いによって、手指の消毒にご協力ください。
- 3つの密(密閉・密集・密接)とならないようお互いに注意してください。受験生同士で集まったり、私語を交 わしたり、一緒に食事をしたりすることは、教室外でも避けてください。
- 試験終了後は速やかに帰宅してください。

以下の各項に一つでもあてはまる場合は、受験をご遠慮ください。

- ・37.5℃以上の発熱を伴う風邪の症状がある場合。
- ・新型コロナウイルス感染症を含む感染症に感染している、またはその感染症の出席停止期間にあたる場合
- ・新型コロナウイルス感染症が疑われる場合(濃厚接触者※を含む)。
 - ※濃厚接触者 : 受験生が保健所から新型コロナウィルス感染症に係る濃厚接触者に該当するとされた場合でも、次の(1)~(3) の要件をすべて満たす受験生に対しては、別室での受験を認めます。この場合は、事前に電話で学生部大学院入試担当までお
 - (1) 原則 PCR 検査の結果、陰性であること

 - (2) 受験当日も無症状であること (3) 公共の交通機関を利用せず、かつ人が密集する場所を避けて受験会場に来場できること
- ・試験当日の時点で、国外から日本への入国後14日間経過していない場合
- ●学校保健安全法で出席の停止が定められている感染症に関する注意事項 本学の入学試験では、学校保健安全法で出席の停止が定められている感染症(新型コロナウイルス感染症、インフルエンザ等)に罹患し治癒していない場合、他の受験生や試験監督者等への感染のおそれがあるため、受験をご遠慮いただいて おります(病状により学校医その他の医師において伝染のおそれがないと認めたときは、この限りではありません)。

Keio University Graduate School of Economics Measures, etc., to prevent infections by COVID-19 (coronavirus disease) To all students taking the entrance examinations for Master's and Doctoral Programs in Application Period I, 2022

From the standpoint of preventing COVID-19 infections, the following points will be taken into due consideration for the entrance examinations of the Graduate School of Economics which will be held on July 9 and 10 at Mita Campus. Please note that no special measures such as makeup exams or the implementation of online exams will be carried out for the entrance examinations.

Measures to prevent infection and the spread of COVID-19

It is intended for the seats at the examination venues to be designated so that social distancing can be maintained between the examinees. The exam rooms are ventilated and disinfected regularly. In addition, the examination proctors will all be wearing masks and face shields.

In preparation for the examinations, applicants are requested to regularly follow measures to prevent infections including wearing a mask, washing your hands and gargling. We ask for your understanding and cooperation on the following measures taken on the day of the examinations.

- Applicants for the first screening of the master's' program are allowed to enter the examination venue 30 minutes prior to the designated assembly time. Detailed information about the second screening (meeting time and venue) will be indicated at 7:00PM, July 9.
- Your body temperature will be checked by thermal camera when coming on campus. If you are suspected of having a fever (37.5 degrees Celsius or higher*), your temperature will be taken using a contactless thermometer. You will not be permitted to enter the campus if your temperature is 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher. Please note that no special measures such as makeup exams or the implementation of online exams will be carried out for the entrance examinations.

*If an applicant's natural body temperature is high in average, please submit a daily body temperature record recorded 7 days prior to the exam day

- Please be sure that you are properly wearing a mask (non-woven masks are recommended) when you enter the campus and present your examination admission card at the campus entrance (Main Gate or East Gate). If you do not have your examination admission card or are not wearing a mask, you will not be permitted entry; however, we do ask everyone to cooperate with removing their masks when instructed to do so by examination proctors checking the photo identification of examinees.
- Please assist with keeping the venue sterile by washing your hands and using the alcohol-based disinfectants available at the entrances of the examination venues.
- Please take care around other people on campus so as to avoid the three Cs (closed spaces/crowded places/close-contact settings). Please avoid unnecessary contact with other applicants, including having a meal and a conversation at inside/outside the rooms.
- Once the entrance examination has ended, please promptly vacate the campus and return home.

Please refrain from taking the exam if any of the following apply:

- If you have cold symptoms with a fever of 37.5°C or higher.
- · If you are infected with an infectious disease including COVID-19, or are prohibited from coming on campus due to the confinement period for an infectious disease.
- · If you are suspected of being infected with COVID-19 (including being considered as a person who has been in close contact with an infected individual.
 - **Person who has been in close contact with an infected individual: Even if an applicant taking an exam is considered to be a person who has been in close contact with an individual infected with COVID-19 by a public health center, if he/she meets all of the conditions outlined in (1) to (3) below, then he/she will be permitted to take the exam in a separate exam venue. In this case, please contact the Office of Student Services Graduate Admissions Section by telephone in advance.

 (1) In principle, the result of your PCR test is negative.

 - (2) You have no symptoms on the day of the examination.
 (3) You can travel to the examination venue avoiding crowded places and without using public transportation.
- · If it is 14 days or less since you entered Japan from overseas on the day of the examination.
- During the entrance examinations at Keio University, examinees must refrain from taking exams if they are suffering and have yet to recover from an infectious disease for which attendance at university must be suspended according to the School Health and Safety Act (COVID-19, influenza, etc.) because of the risk of infection to other examinees and the examination proctors (unless it has been acknowledged by a school doctor or other physician that the disease symptoms do not pose any risk of infecting others).
